JACKIE'S STORY



Jackie Yorkey has been serving with Watts Powerhouse Church since 2007. Her Life Group had the goal of living mission-minded has seen that a critical element of healing comes through therapy, and dedicated every third Sunday of the month to serving food at Watts.

She and her husband, Patrick, continue to serve at Watts today. Over time, their involvement continued to grow. They began planning events like an annual Christmas party where the focus is creating a joyful and fun memory for the community, especially the kids. They've committed to being consistently present for the kids in the community. One of the boys, Ramir, has grown up alongside their three sons and over the years, both Ramir and his grandmother have become like family.

The Yorkey's primary ministry is to show the love of Jesus through the building of relationships. The members of Watts are their close friends, and whenever they reach out with needs, whether to help with a funeral or to host a young adult gathering, they make themselves available.

Jackie earned her Master's in Marriage and Family Therapy from Fuller Seminary and has been a therapist at CIFT since 2007. As a trauma-informed therapist, she's trained in EMDR and Havening: neuroscience-based techniques to heal trauma.

In Watts, there's a lot of generational trauma. Jackie knows and where people can talk about their trauma, suffering, and grief. She's dreamt of a therapy clinic in Watts to provide resources for healing. Jackie's dreams started to become a reality as CIFT began developing plans.

Simultaneously, there were heartbreaking losses of life within the Watts community. Though there's a stigma around therapy in Watts, a mother who had recently lost her son shared a testimony about how attending therapy has helped her while she was grieving. Once the Yorkey's announced to the church that they wanted to bring a therapy clinic to the city, the whole church wanted to play a part. Jackie was beginning to see how God was orchestrating all the pieces together and that role was to continue being dependent and obedient to Him.

The clinic's main goal is to provide a year of free, high-quality care for the community to begin healing trauma. Unlike most government-run clinics that provide a care limit between 5 to 10 sessions, this will be the first clinic in LA County to provide free care for this length of time.

Jackie knows that this is real change: therapy can truly help people. As we serve and care for people living in poverty and gang-infiltrated areas, helping those people receive the healing and care they need is what can make a lifelong impact.




TABLE GROUPS
